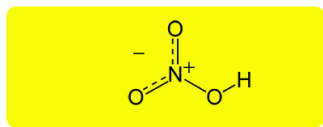


The Acid Remedies

The seminar will focus on the Acid Remedies, both organic acids (Carbolic ac., Benzoic ac., Picric ac., Acetic ac., Lactic ac., Oxalic ac., Salicylic ac., Gallic ac. etc.) and inorganic acids (Phosphoric ac., Muriatic ac., Sulphuric ac., Nitric ac.)

We will study the common themes of the Acids, and differentiate between the organic and inorganic, looking at the chemical components (moieties) of each acid molecule which is very helpful for understanding of the themes. For instance, some acids like Benzoic ac. are aromatic, i.e. based on a carbon (benzene) ring structure, others like Acetic ac. are aliphatic, i.e. based on a carbon chain. It is

fascinating to see that from the case taking one can identify which issues the patient has, and match them with the particular components of the remedy they need ... ie one can spot the benzene ring, or the alcohol or the nitrate moiety etc. according to its individual mental and physical themes. This makes case taking and case analysis much more accurate and rewarding.

Understanding the themes of the aliphatic vs. aromatic molecules opens up further understanding of the Organic and Hydrocarbon remedies, a huge group of poorly understood remedies like Pix liquida, Alcoholus, Saccharum album etc., as described by Roger Morrison in his seminal book 'Carbon'. To further contrast and compare, we will also look at a few Organic and Hydrocarbon cases that are not acids.

All the teaching will be illustrated by study of Julie Geraghty's cured cases, as well as information and cases from Dr Massimo Mangialavori's book of seminar notes "Self destructiveness: acute and chronic attitudes to injuring the self in Acid remedies".

Dr. Julie Geraghty needs little introduction, as she is one of the finest classical homeopaths and exponents of the Sensation Method in the UK and abroad. She currently works at the Bristol Homeopathic Hospital where she is also involved in teaching in addition to her own busy private practice in the city. Julie's teaching is friendly, methodical and simple, her cases thorough and clear, making them ideal for beginners as well as advanced homeopaths.
